

BIL Overview

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
 - AKA Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
- National Infrastructure Investment = \$1.2 Trillion across 5 years
 - Nearly 400 programs across 12 Federal Agencies
 - 60% Formula / 40% Discretionary




Formula vs. Discretionary


Guaranteed vs. Earned



40101(d) Grid Resiliency Grants

DOE's Objectives:

- Improve the all-hazards resilience of the electric grid against disruptive events.
 - An event in which operations of the electric grid are disrupted, preventively shut off, or cannot operate safely due to extreme weather, wildfire, or a natural disaster.
- Investment in modernized grid infrastructure that can enable consumer access to lower-cost energy.
- Accommodate increased electrification, renewables, and distributed systems.



40101(d) Grid Resiliency Grants

Summary:

- Program appropriates approximately \$471 million funding in FY2022 and approximately \$459 million per year for FY 2023-2026.
- Kansas' portion is approximately \$6.7 million for FY 2022 and \$6.6 million for FY 2023. (\$13.3M total)
- The State is subgranting to eligible entities for approved projects.
- Potential subrecipients submitted project applications to KCC: 31 received, 11 selected to advance by KCC.
- Advanced applications formally applied to BKF
- Steering Committee reviewed 4-3-23; presenting to Advisory Committee today
- KCC will forward the project applications to DOE as soon as advice is received.

Background and Purpose

In 2023, Governor Laura Kelly and the Kansas Legislature, through Sen. Sub. for HB 2302, increased the amount of state funding for the State Water Plan Fund (SWPF). In August of 2022, the Kansas Water Authority approved the updated Kansas Water Plan, which the Kansas Water Office had developed with input from federal, state, and local agencies, regional advisory committees, non-profit organizations, and members of the public. During the following legislative session, Sen. Sub. for HB 2302 became law. Its provisions included the creation of two new water-related grant funds: the Technical Assistance Grant Fund and the Water Projects Grant Fund. The two grant funds serve to help identified Kansas entities to obtain the up-front technical assistance and the on-the-ground actions needed to address various water quantity and quality needs. The two funds are generally directed to supporting water-related infrastructure activities. The new law directs the Kansas Water Office (KWO) to administer these two grant programs, according to certain criteria and parameters.

Dear Representative Waymaster,

During the March 14, 2024, Build Kansas Advisory Committee meeting, the City of Hays Build Kansas application #2024-015-NWKPDC (Application) was discussed. The Steering Committee recommended awarding \$12.5 million in Build Kansas funds to Hays to leverage \$50 million in FEMA grant funds for the R9 water project.

The cities of Russell and Hays are joint owners of the R9 Ranch in Edwards County. Russell owns 18 percent, and Hays owns 82 percent. In 2014, the two cities entered into an interlocal agreement regarding developing the R9 as a long-term water supply to serve both cities. The






